

The Unitarian Church



Located in the heart of the downtown historic district at 126 Union Street, the Unitarian Church now known as the Union Street Brick Church "The Brick" was completed in 1853. It boasts having the tallest steeple in Maine and is on the National Registry of Historic Buildings. Today, according to the Union Street Brick Church website, "Spiritually, it is home to an independent Congregational society whose dedication is to Christian worship, and to a strong encouragement of the arts -- theater, music, dance, painting, and the like. Who we are... A Church for the Arts and Artists of Bangor." The First Universalist Church on Park Street and the Unitarian Church on Union Street merged in 1995 to become the Unitarian Universalist Society of Bangor. The Unitarians sold their building on Union Street and began worshipping at the Park Street church.
